Independent Family Visit to the Lightner Museum for Children on the Autism Spectrum








When we arrive at the museum there will be a courtyard full of beautiful plants and tall palm trees.

The entrance to the museum is through an arched doorway across the courtyard.






Next, we will pay admission to enter the Museum. Sometimes there is a line at the Admissions Desk.

I may need to wait for a few minutes. I will stay with my group and wait in line for tickets.

This area might be busy, but should not be loud. Everyone uses an inside voice in the Museum.

I will get an admission sticker to wear on my clothes.



Food and drink are not allowed inside the museum galleries. I will leave any food and drink I brought at the admission desk. I will pick it up when I leave the museum.



We can pick up a Museum Map at the Information Desk so we can plan where we will go and what we will see.

Do Not Touch

Do not touch signs are all around the Museum.

I will look, but I will not touch the artwork and objects on display. I will enjoy seeing things and learning about the things I see.



There are friendly volunteers in the Museum. Volunteers wear a name card on a lanyard around their necks.

I will ask a volunteer if I have questions about things I see in the Museum, or if I need help finding my way.



Some areas of the Museum, like the restaurant might be loud and busy. If I need to leave the Museum, my sticker will let me come back the same day.
